District Profile

Sanitary District No. 5 of Marin County is an independent Special District that provides the collection, treatment, and disposal of wastewater for the City of Belvedere and the Town of Tiburon, south of Gilmartin Drive.

The District operates and maintains two treatment facilities, 24 pump stations, and 34 miles of sanitary sewer lines. District staff performs most work in-house as it owns and operates a rodder and vactor truck for collection system maintenance activities. Operations staff perform general preventative maintenance and corrective maintenance tasks on the District's equipment. There is a great sense of pride and ownership in the work our staff undertakes on a day to day basis. Because of the small size of the District staff members wear multiple hats which provides for a greater opportunity to learn and get experience in the wastewater field.

The Tiburon Main WWTP is a .98MGD conventional activated sludge treatment facility.

The Paradise Cove WWTP is a .040MGD extended aeration activated sludge package treatment plant.

The District currently has 12 full time employees and is governed by a knowledgeable, dedicated, and community-oriented Board of Directors.

The District operates on a 4-10 schedule from 0530-1530hrs. Cross training opportunities are available.

Position Overview

Under general supervision, performs the full array of duties, including the maintenance tasks for the sewer collection system, pump stations, treatment plant, grounds, and related District facilities and equipment; demonstrates a full understanding of all applicable policies, procedures, and work methods associated with assigned duties; performs other related duties as required.

Education/Certifications Required:

Any combination of education and experience that has provided the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary for a **Wastewater Treatment Collection System & Plant Maintenance Technician**. A typical way of obtaining the required qualifications is to possess the equivalent of one year of experience in sewer collection system and treatment plant facilities maintenance or the performance of related work, and a high school diploma or equivalent.

Possession of a valid California motor vehicle driver's license and a good driving record that meets the requirements established by the District. Failure to maintain an acceptable driving record shall be cause for discipline, up to and including dismissal. Possession of a Grade I-III Wastewater Collection System Maintenance Certificate issued by the California Water Environment Association, as well as a Grade I-III Mechanical Technologist Certificate and/or Grade I-III Electrical/Instrumentation Certificate issued by the California Water Environment Association are highly desirable.
